ICELAND, the world's most uniquely-shaped country, known as natural geological museum.

Situated at the junction of the North Atlantic and Arctic Oceans, it's one of the five Nordic countries, covering an area of 103,000 square kilometers. While Iceland is part of Europe, geographically, it's not on the European mainland; instead, it's a remote island in the North Atlantic, closest to Greenland, the Faroe Islands, and the United Kingdom. Due to its location at the meeting point of the Eurasian and North American tectonic plates, Iceland boasts active volcanoes, earning it the nickname 'Land of Ice and Fire.' Erupting geysers, magnificent glaciers, and waterfalls, making it a haven for photographers and nature enthusiasts.

Iceland lies entirely within the auroral zone, making it the only country globally where the Northern Lights can be witnessed throughout. In the summer, the land enjoys cool breezes and endless daylight, with a sea of lupines and puffin sightings.

Accommodation will be changed almost everyday, so tour members can have a more complete Icelandic stay experience.




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DINING

DAY '

KEF Airport - Grundarfjörður

- Arrive early at Iceland's airport. Afterward, tour leader and driver will meet everyone at the airport.
- After lunch, drive to the Snæfellsnes peninsula. Here we start exploring the sights of the peninsula, including the black church of Búðir, the beautiful fishing port town of Arnarstapi.

Accommodation: Nordic style cottage/ hotel

Distance: about 289km Duration: approx 4.5hours

Grundarfjörður - Stykkishólmur - Skogarfoss Area

- After breakfast, we'll explore the peninsula's most famous attraction, Kirkjufell, also known as Church Mountain, which is famous for its unique shape. This is one of Iceland's must-see destinations and is said to be the most photographed mountain in Iceland.
- In the afternoon, we enter the small town of Stykkishólmur in Snæfellsnes. This is where the movie "The Secret Life of Walter Mitty" was filmed.
- Head to the town of Skogafoss.

Distance: about 348km Duration: approx 5hours

DAY 2

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Skogafoss Area - Reynisfjara Area - Vik

- After breakfast, head to Seljalandfoss and Skogafoss.
- Visit the church in the town of Vik, where you can enjoy the most charming panoramic views of the town.
- After lunch, proceed to the nearby Reynisfjara Black Sand Beach and the basalt rock formations.
- Visit the famous Icelandic landmark, Solheimasandur Plane Wreck. A truck bus will transport us round trip, saving the four-hour walk (depending on weather conditions).



Accommodation: Nordic style cottage/ hotel

Distance: about 75km Duration: approx 1.5hours

Vik - Kirkjubæjarklaustur - Jokulsarlon Area

- We will continue along Highway No. 1 to Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon and Diamond Beach on the opposite bank.
- Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon is the most famous ice lagoon in Iceland, and Diamond Beach is another popular natural attractions. Here you can see the story of how snow drifting down became ice and melted, then flowed to the sea after a thousand years.
- If time allows, we will be a visit to nearby attractions.

Distance: about 193km Duration: approx 2.5hours

DAY 4

9 DAYS 8 NIGHTS ITINERARY NCONTROLLABLE /

DAY 5

Jokulsarlon - Skogarfoss

- Today we will go to Ice Cave (subject to weather conditions).
- After that, we proceed to the Vatnajökull National Park to see the largest glacier in Europe up close.
- After lunch, we will visit Fjaðrárgljúfur Canyon.
- We continue driving towards the direction of the capital.



Accommodation: Nordic style cottage/ hotel

Distance: about 233km Duration: approx 3.5hours

Skogarfoss - Laugarvatn Area

- After breakfast, head to other surrounding attractions along the way.
- After lunch, we proceed to the Thingvellir National Park. Here you can walk in the rift valley of the mid-Atlantic ridge of the two major continents of Europe and America.
- If time allows, we will be a visit to nearby attractions.

Distance: about 142km Duration: approx 2hours

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Laugarvatn Area

- After breakfast, we visit a traditional geothermal bakery in Iceland.
- Then head to the Gullfoss (Waterfall) and Strokkur (Geyser).
- If time allows, we will be a visit to nearby attractions.

DAY 7

Distance: about 48km Duration: approx 1hour

DAY 8

Laugarvatn Area - Reykjavik City Tour - Blue Lagoon - Keflavik

- After breakfast, we will visit Reykjavik, the beautiful Nordic capital, and take pictures in the alleys.
- Then proceed to Hallgrimskirkja, the beautiful cathedral.
- We will have local snacks (hot dog / lobster soup) for lunch.
- After lunch, we head to Blue Lagoon for a hot spring. Relax before the end of the trip.



THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE COMING TO ICELAND

- Iceland's weather is unpredictable. We may have to meet road closure when the weather is bad, and face unexpected situations at any time, and then change the itinerary / accommodation.
- Some attractions require a short walk to reach.
- Tour members need to have strong physical fitness, no underlying diseases (asthma, high blood pressure, heart disease) and enough equipment to withstand the cold temperature.
- The aurora will be tracked throughout the journey, but the aurora is a peculiar natural phenomenon that requires luck and a positive mindset, and can only be seen when the weather is clear.
- This tour will travel throughout Iceland in a private transport driven by a professional Icelandic driver (accompanied by a tour leader photoshoot throughout the journey). Each day, there will be a change of accommodation location to provide tour members with a comprehensive experience of Iceland. We will primarily choose hotels for accommodation. If staying in a hotel, dinner will be provided externally, and the hotel will include breakfast for the following day. If staying in guesthouses, we can also take the group to supermarkets to purchase ingredients for everyone to prepare breakfast and dinner together.
- This trip is suitable for those who love to make friends and nature. The tour members need to cooperate and help each other.
- Due to the limited space in the carriage, the luggage of the tour members are: a medium suitcase (27inch) + a hand luggage bag + a small backpack.

DETAILS

- Group size: 14-16 members per group with 1-2 tour leaders

Remark:

- For solo travellers, we will do our best to find a roommate for you. Otherwise, a single-room supplement will apply.
- Once the group is formed, the tour leader will provide details regarding flight tickets. Participants are responsible for purchasing their own flight tickets and following up on the status of their tickets.
- Registration is confirmed upon receipt of the deposit payment. Limited spots are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Term & Condition

- 1.A deposit is required for reservation. The full balance must be paid within the specified time frame, no later than 45 days before departure. Failure to comply may lead to reservation cancellation and deposit forfeiture.
- 2. Cancellation policy:
 - a. Cancellation of reservation must be made in writing to avoid any misunderstanding.
 - b. If no replacement is found, cancellation charges apply based on when we receive notice:
 - i.45 days or more before the date of departure Forfeiture of tour deposit
 - ii.22 44 days before the date of departure 70% of tour fare non-refundable
 - iii. Within 21 days before the date of departure 100% of tour fare non-refundable
 - iv. No refund for fees already incurred and non-refundable from other relevant authorities, e.g., flight or train tickets
- 3. If there are any unforeseen circumstances or uncontrollable/force majeure (weather, tide, nature factor, traffic delays/cancellations, illness, pandemic, strikes, war or other causes), the company reserve the right to make changes to/cancel itinerary or postpone the tour at any time, no refunds are available.
- 4. Travel Document:
 - a. A tour member must have: An international passport or other recognized travel documents which should be valid for at least 6 months from the date of return to the country of origin; The necessary visa and vaccination and health certificates as required by the various authorities of the countries to be visited.
 - b. The company is not responsible for expenses, reimbursement, or tour price refund if a member is denied entry or deported due to improper documents or other reasons.
- 5. No refund or reduction will be made to any member in respect of airfare, accommodation, meals, sightseeing tours, transport or any other services which are included in the tour fare out not utilized by the tour member due to personal reasons.
- 6. The company reserves the right to cancel or withdraw any itinerary, or any reservation made for a client or decline to accept or retain any person from being a tour member if he is likely to endanger the health or safety, or impair the comfort or enjoyment of others on the tour.

Appreciate the breathtaking view of magnificent; waterfalls; and unlimited viewing of picturesque Icelandic rainbows (subject to weather condition)












Diamond Beach



1. What months can you see the Northern Lights in Iceland?

You can typically see the Northern Lights in Iceland between September and March. However, it's not guaranteed every day, and they are most spectacular when the sky is clear and visibility is high.

2. When is the best time to visit Iceland?

Iceland is a great destination to visit year-round. In the winter, you can witness the mysterious Northern Lights, while in the summer, there's the romantic midnight sun. It's definitely a travel destination you don't want to miss in your lifetime.

3. Is summer a suitable time to visit Iceland? What are the attractions?

Summer in Iceland is relatively warm, with average temperatures ranging from 10-20°C, making it a great season for a refreshing escape. During this time, daylight hours are incredibly long, making it ideal for sightseeing and exploration.

Summer is the peak tourist season in Iceland. You can enjoy the phenomenon of the midnight sun, vast fields of blooming lupines along the roadsides, excellent opportunities to observe puffins, and witness astonishing natural wonders.

4. What is the largest glacier in Iceland?

Vatnajökull Glacier is the largest glacier in Iceland and even in Europe! Our Bucket List itinerary will take you up close to admire this extensive glacier in a national park.

5. What is the best month to visit the Ice Cave? Can children participate?

Ice caves are only available end of autumn to winter season (end of September to March), depending on the weather conditions. If the temperatures are too high, it's not safe to enter the ice caves.

Children as young as 8 years old can participate, and there's no significant difficulty involved. As long as they meet the age requirement, most children can join. Walking inside the ice cave requires caution, and carrying or piggybacking a child is not advisable.



6. Are helmets and crampons provided for the Ice Caves hiking? What clothing should I prepare?

When participating in the Ice Caves hiking in Iceland, professional guides will lead the tours, and you should never attempt these activities on your own, as it can be dangerous. Guides will provide essential safety equipment, including crampons. It is recommended that group members wear waterproof and warm clothing, sturdy waterproof hiking boots with high ankle support to protect your ankles (If you don't have suitable footwear, you can usually rent them on-site).

7. How should I prepare clothing for a trip to Iceland?

Iceland's weather is notoriously changeable year-round, and you might even experience a romantic encounter with sun, rain, wind, and snow all in one day. It's advisable to use the "onion layering" technique and prioritize staying warm. Bring waterproof and windproof down jackets, warm clothing, and more.

8. Is Iceland expensive?

Iceland is one of the most expensive countries in the world in terms of the cost of living. Many items have to be imported into the country, which contributes to the relatively high prices.

9. What is the currency in Iceland?

The primary currency in Iceland is the Icelandic Króna (ISK)/EURO. However, it's advisable to use credit cards, as they are widely accepted throughout Iceland.

10. What is Icelandic food like?

Iceland is surrounded by the sea, so fish and seafood are essential components of Icelandic cuisine. Traditional Icelandic dishes typically revolve around fish, dairy products, bread, potatoes, and lamb. Some Icelandic specialties include Skyr yogurt, lamb, seafood, dried fish, and more. An average meal in Iceland costs between EUR 23-30.
